WASHINGTON, D.C. (February 11, 2020) – Today, 23 patient and consumer organizations representing millions of people facing serious, acute, chronic health conditions, issued the following statement in response to the **House Committee on Education and Labor's** markup of legislation intended to prevent patients from facing surprise medical bills:

"The <u>Ban Surprise Billing Act</u> offers robust protections for all patients in all health settings. Our organizations applaud the Education and Labor Committee markup of legislation that would protect patients from surprise medical bills. Importantly, these protections extend to patients covered by employer-sponsored plans, and they apply to patients carried by emergency air transportation.

Surprise billing affects millions of patients each year and is a growing concern for our organizations and the patients we serve. Our organizations appreciate the committee's commitment to advancing this important legislation. Patients and consumers need Congress to act to protect them from the potential for massive medical debt caused by surprise medical bills. We urge Congress to work quickly to enact bipartisan legislation that will address this growing problem and lower patients' health care costs.
