Dear Mr. Parker:

I write regarding the Department of Labor's Emergency Temporary Standard (ETS) protecting workers in health care and related settings from exposure to COVID-19.¹

In the months following publication of the ETS on June 21, 2021, COVID-19 remains a grave danger to workers. According to the Peterson Center on Healthcare and Kaiser Family Foundation, COVID-19 was the third leading cause of death in the U.S. in November 2021.² The spread of the Delta variant reversed the downward trend in deaths per day from the virus starting in August 2021, and the increase continues: while COVID-19 claimed 1,100 lives per day on average in November 2021, that number climbed to almost 1,600 lives per day in the first eight days of December 2021.³ Additionally, just within the past few weeks, a new variant—Omicron—has been detected and has started to spread in at least 31 states.⁴

The June 2021 ETS was promulgated pursuant to section 6(c) of the Occupational Safety and Health Act, which directs the Department to publish a final standard "no later than six months after publication of the emergency standard." That statutory deadline is December 21. Given the approaching deadline, and the ongoing grave danger posed by COVID-19 to some of the
