Coverage of COVID-19 Treatment at No Cost- Sharing	 Authorizing Language: Requires all plans to cover treatment for COVID- 19 at no cost-sharing. 	None	
Prescription Drug Refill Notifications During Emergencies	 Authorizing Language: Requires plans to notify consumers of advance prescription drug refill options during emergency periods. 	None	

Subsidies for COBRA and Furloughed Workers	 Authorizing Language: Provides subsidies to allow workers to maintain their employer-sponsored coverage if they become eligible for COBRA or are subject to a temporary furlough. 	None		
Improvements to COBRA Notices	 Authorizing Language: Improves COBRA notices provided to workers who lose employer-sponsored coverage by including information about ACA options. 	None

Emergency Relief for School Meal and Child and Adult Care Food Programs	 Authorizing Language: Provides emergency relief to help school meal and child and adult care food programs, which are in dire need of financial assistance, to continue serving children and families. 	None		
Pandemic EBT	 Authorizing Language: Extends the Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) program through the summer and until schools reopen, and expands the program to include children who would be receiving meals at child care except for COVID-19 related closures. 	None		
Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program	 Authorizing Language: Provides schools increased flexibility to provide children in low-income communities with fresh fruit and vegetable snacks through the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program. 	None

Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)	• Nearly triples the value of the WIC Cash Value Voucher (CVV) for women and children through the end of fiscal year 2020.	
	 Appropriations: \$1.1 billion for WIC to ensure funding is sufficient to cover any increased participation in the program, and to fund the increased CVV benefit. 	
Child Nutrition Waiver Transparency	 Authorizing Language: Requires the Secretary of Agriculture to make publicly available all child nutrition waiver applications, approvals, and denials pursuant to the Families First Coronavirus Response Act in a timely manner. 	None
Developmental Disabilities Act	 Appropriations: \$5 million for Assistive Technology Act Programs. \$5 million for the purchase of equipment to enable interpreters to provide services to the deaf community remotely. 	 Appropriations: \$10,000,000 to support protection and advocacy systems.
