## Pandemic EBT Expiration Dates and Eligible Children

The *Families First Coronavirus Response Act* established the P-EBT program, which allows states to provide additional food aid to families who are missing out on free or reduced-price school meals due to school closures. This program was incredibly effective. The week after states rolled out P-EBT benefits, P-EBT prevented <u>at least 2.7 million children from going hungry.</u>

By Labor Day, P-EBT benefits will expire in 33 states, leaving more than 14 million eligible children without critical food assistance at a time when most schools are unable to physically reopen safely.
