Dear Secretary Becerra:

As leaders of the Committee on Education and Labor and coauthors of surprise billing legislation during the 116th Congress, we appreciate the steps the Department of Health and Human Services, as well your colleagues at the Departments of Labor and the Treasury (collectively, the Departments), have taken to implement the *No Surprises Act*² and to protect patients from surprise medical bills. As you continue this important work, we urge you to take immediate action to establish the Advisory Committee on Ground Ambulance and Patient Billing (the Advisory Committee).

As you are aware, section 117 of the *No Surprises Act* requires the establishment of the Advisory Committee for the purpose of reviewing options to protect consumers from exorbitant charges and surprise out-of-network bills for ground ambulance services.³ Studies show that about half of such services are out-of-network⁴ and generate a median surprise bill of \$450 for a single ambulance ride.⁵ Section 117 also requires the Advisory Committee to develop recommendations to improve the disclosure of charges and fees for ground ambulance services, better inform consumers of insurance options for such services, protect consumers from balance billing, and then submit a report to the Departments and the congressional committees of

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jurisdiction no later than 180 days after the date of its first meeting.⁶ The statutory deadline for establishing the Advisory Committee was March 27, 2021.⁷ We understand that your Department, in coordination with the Departments of Labor and the Treasury, has taken some initial steps to establish the Advisory Committee, including the signing of a charter and a solicitation for the nomination of committee members published in the Federal Register.⁸ However, the period for submitting nominations closed on December 13, 2021, and it appears that no further action has been taken.

Full implementation and robust enforcement of the *No Surprises Act* is vital to ensuring comprehensive surprise billing protections for consumers. While progress has been made to protect patients from surprise billing, there is still work to do to achieve the full promise of the law, including expanding its protections and closing gaps that remain in several areas such as ground ambulance services. The Advisory Committee is an important step that will inform regulators and legislators in addressing this problem, and we urge you to prioritize and complete its establishment expeditiously.
