Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act

State-by-State Emergency Education and Child Care Funding

Background

The *Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act* provides \$30.75 billion for the new Education Stabilization Fund, which includes:

- \$3 billion for the Governor's Emergency Education Relief Fund, which governors can use at their discretion to support their K-12 and higher education needs related to COVID-19;
- \$13 billion for the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund, which states can use for a wide range of purposes, including purchasing computers and hot spot devices for online learning; purchasing supplies for cleaning and sanitization, supporting professional development for educators, and supporting access to quality instruction for students with disabilities; and
- \$14 billion for the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund, which is awarded directly to institutions of higher education.

The CARES Act provides \$3.5 billion in supplemental funding for the Child Care and Development Block Grant (CCDBG), which helps low-income families access child care. Supplemental funds will give assistance to child care providers to help them pay employees, maintain or resume operations, and provide child care assistance for health care workers, emergency responders, sanitation workers, and other essential workers.

The *CARES Act* also provides an additional \$750 million in emergency funding for Head Start, which will be used to maintain access to services for children and families, to the extent possible, and provide funding for summer programming in areas of the country that are ready to reopen.

Estimated State-by-State Education and Child Care Funding under the CARES Act

Emergency education and child care funds are distributed according to formulas outlined in the CARES Act. The table below reflects state estimates from the Congressional Research Service.
