Family Violence and Prevention Services Improvement Act of 2021

Estimated Increases in State funding for Shelter, Services and Support

H.R. 2119, the *Family Violence Prevention and Services Improvement Act of 2021*, (FVPSA) is a comprehensive reauthorization of the *Family Violence Prevention and Services Act* that will enhance and refocus federal investments to address intimate partner violence (IPV).

On average, this bill will *increase funding by 37 percent* for state programs and *45 percent* for Tribal communities, allowing programs to:

- Increase prevention efforts, therefore reducing the rate of intimate partner violence and decreasing the funding needs for support services;
- Increase dedicated resources for over-represented and underserved populations, including communities of color, Tribal communities, LGBTQ+ individuals, and people with disabilities; and
- Ensure survivors can receive culturally appropriate, accessible services.
