

**SUBSTITUTE OFFERED BY MS. FOXX OF NORTH  
CAROLINA  
FOR THE AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUB-  
STITUTE OFFERED BY MRS. MCBATH OF  
GEORGIA**

Strike all after the enacting clause and insert the following:

**1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2       This Act may be cited as the “School Safety and Pre-  
3 paredness Act”.

**4 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

5       In this Act:

6           (1) OTHER STAFF.—The term “other staff”—

7               (A) has the meaning given such term in  
8               section 8101(35) of the Elementary and Sec-  
9               ondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C.  
10              7801(35)); and

11            (B) shall be construed to apply to all  
12            schools (as defined in paragraph (2)).

13           (2) SCHOOL.—The term “school” means—

14               (A) an early childhood education program  
15               (as defined in section 103 of the Higher Edu-  
16               cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1003));

1 (B) an elementary school (as defined in  
2 section 8101(19) of the Elementary and Sec-  
3 ondary Education Act of 1965 (20  
4 U.S.C.7801(19)));

5 (C) a secondary school (as defined in sec-  
6 tion 8101(45) of the Elementary and Secondary  
7 Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C.7801(45)));  
8 and

9 (D) an institution of higher education (as  
10 defined in section 102 of the Higher Education  
11 Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1002)).

12 (3) SCHOOL LEADER.—The term “school lead-  
13 er”—

14 (A) has the meaning given such term in  
15 section 8101(44) of the Elementary and Sec-  
16 ondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C.  
17 7801(44)); and

18 (B) includes the chief administrative offi-  
19 cer of a school defined in subparagraph (A) or  
20 (D) of paragraph (2).

21 (4) STUDENT.—The term “student” means an  
22 individual who is enrolled in, and attending classes  
23 at, a school.

1 **SEC. 3. ANNUAL REPORT ON INDICATORS OF SCHOOL**  
2 **CRIME AND SAFETY.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—

4 (1) REPORT.—The Secretary of Education,  
5 through the National Center for Education Statistics  
6 of the Department of Education and in conjunction  
7 with the Bureau of Justice Statistics of the Office  
8 of Justice Programs of the Department of Justice,  
9 shall publish not less frequently than annually an  
10 updated version of the National Center for Edu-  
11 cation Statistics report NCES 2019–047 issued in  
12 April 2019.

13 (2) CONSULTATION.—In carrying out para-  
14 graph (1), the Secretary of Education shall consult  
15 with the Attorney General, the Secretary of Home-  
16 land Security, and the Secretary of Health and  
17 Human Services.

18 (b) STATISTICS ON SCHOOL CRIME AND SAFETY.—  
19 In collecting data on school crime and safety to be com-  
20 piled in the annual report described in subsection (a), the  
21 Secretary of Education, in consultation with the Attorney  
22 General, the Secretary of Homeland Security, and the Sec-  
23 retary of Health and Human Services, shall periodically  
24 review the data available to compile the report and deter-  
25 mine if the data is sufficient to provide an accurate anal-  
26 ysis of the crime and safety of schools.

1           (c) SAFETY AND PREVENTION.—In compiling the an-  
2 nual report described in subsection (a), the Secretary of  
3 Education shall analyze the existence or absence of safety  
4 and prevention measures at schools and make rec-  
5 ommendations, when sufficient evidence exists to support  
6 such recommendations, about the safety and prevention  
7 measures in schools that might mitigate or prevent crime  
8 and safety incidents.

9           (d) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—In collecting data on  
10 crime and safety incidents to be compiled in the annual  
11 report described in subsection (a), no data shall be re-  
12 ported in a case where data is insufficient to yield statis-  
13 tically reliable information or the results would reveal per-  
14 sonally identifiable information about an individual stu-  
15 dent, teacher, school leader, or other staff.

Amend the title so as to read: “A bill to require the Secretary of Education, in consultation with the Attorney General, the Secretary of Homeland Security, and the Secretary of Health and Human Services, to publish an annual report on indicators of school crime and safety.”.
