National Head Start Association Statement on The Introduction of the Strong Start for America's Children Act of 2013

Washington, DC—Today Senator Tom Harkin, Chairman of the Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions, Congressman George Miller, Ranking Member on the House Committee on Education and the Workforce, and Congressman Richard Hanna of New York introduced legislation to expand access to pre-kindergarten programs across the United States. We applaud the sponsors of the Strong Start for America Act for their leadership and look forward to continuing to work with them over the coming weeks and months to refine the legislation."
