To amend the Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967 and other laws to clarify appropriate standards for Federal employment discrimination and retaliation claims, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Protecting Older
- 5 Workers Against Discrimination Act of 2025".

SEC. 2. STANDARDS OF PROOF. 2 (a) Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 3 1967.— 4 (1) Clarifying prohibition against imper-5 MISSIBLE CONSIDERATION OF AGE IN EMPLOYMENT 6 PRACTICES.—Section 4 of the Age Discrimination in 7 Employment Act of 1967 (29 U.S.C. 623) is amend-8 ed by inserting after subsection (f) the following: 9 "(g) Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, an unlawful practice is established under this chapter when 10 the complaining party demonstrates that age or an activity 11 protected by subsection (d) was a motivating factor for 12 any practice, even though other factors also motivated the 13 practice.". 14 15 (2) Remedies.—Section 7 of such Act (29) 16 U.S.C. 626) is amended— 17 (A) in subsection (b)— 18 (i) in the first sentence, by striking 19 "The" and inserting "(1) The"; 20 (ii) in the third sentence, by striking "Amounts" and inserting the following: 21 22 "(2) Amounts"; 23 (iii) in the fifth sentence, by striking

11	PRACTICES.—Section 703 of the Civil Rights Act of
12	1964 (42 U.S.C. 2000e–2) is amended by striking
13	subsection (m) and inserting the following:
14	"(m) Except as otherwise provided in this title, an
15	unlawful practice is established when the complaining
16	party demonstrates that race, color, religion, sex, national
17	origin, or an activity protected by section 2000e-(3)a of
18	this title was a motivating factor for any practice, even
19	though other factors also motivated the practice.".
20	(2) Federal Employees.—Section 717 of
21	such Act (42 U.S.C. 2000e–16) is amended by add-
22	ing at the end the following:
23	"(g) Sections 2000e-2(m) and 2000e-5(g)(2)(B) of
24	this title shall apply to claims brought under the provi-

1	(c) Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990.—
2	(1) Definitions.—Section 101 of the Ameri-
3	cans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C.
4	12111) is amended by adding at the end the fol-

6	"(11) Demonstrates.—The term 'dem-
7	onstrates' means meets the burdens of production
8	and persuasion.".
9	(2) Clarifying Prohibition against imper-
10	MISSIBLE CONSIDERATION OF DISABILITY IN EM-
11	PLOYMENT PRACTICES.—Section 102 of such Act
12	(42 U.S.C. 12112) is amended by adding at the end
13	the following:
14	"(e) Proof.—
15	"(1) Establishment.—Except as otherwise
16	provided in this chapter, a discriminatory practice is
17	established under this chapter when the complaining
18	party demonstrates that disability or an activity pro-
19	tected by subsection (a) or (b) of section 12203 of
20	this title was a motivating factor for any practice,
21	even though other factors also motivated the prac-
22	tice.".
23	(3) CERTAIN ANTI-RETALIATION CLAIMS.—Sec-
24	tion 503(e) of such Act (42 U.S.C. 12203(e)) is
25	amended—

1	(A) by striking "The remedies" and insert-
2	ing the following:
3	"(1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para-
4	graph (2), the remedies"; and (B) by adding at the
5	end the following:
6	"(2) CERTAIN ANTI-RETALIATION CLAIMS.—
7	Section 12117(c) shall apply to claims under section
8	12112(e)(1) with respect to title I.".
9	(4) Remedies.—Section 107 of such Act (42
10	U.S.C. 12117) is amended by adding at the end the
11	following:
12	"(e) Discriminatory Motivating Factor.—On a
13	claim in which an individual proves a violation under sec-
14	tion 12112(e)(1) of this title, and a respondent dem-
15	onstrates that the respondent would have taken the same
16	action in the absence of the impermissible motivating fac-
17	tor, the court—
18	"(1) may grant declaratory relief, injunctive re-
19	lief (except as provided in paragraph (2)), and attor-
20	ney's fees and costs demonstrated to be directly at-
21	tributable only to the pursuit of a claim under sec-
22	tion $12112(e)(1)$; and
23	"(2) shall not award damages or issue an order
24	requiring any admission, reinstatement, hiring, pro-
25	motion, or payment.".

(d) Rehabilitation Act of 1973.—
(1) In general.—Sections 501(f), 503(d), and
504(d) of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C.
791(f), 793(d), and 794(d)), are each amended by
adding after "title I of the Americans with Disabil-
ities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12111 et seq.)" the fol-
lowing: ", including the standards of causation or
methods of proof applied under section 102(e) of
that Act (42 U.S.C. 12112(e)),".
(2) Federal employees.—The amendment
made by paragraph (1) to section 501(f) of the Re-
habilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 791(f)) shall be
construed to apply to all employees covered by sec-
tion 501 of that Act (29 U.S.C. 791).
SEC. 3. APPLICATION.

SEC. 4. SEVERABILITY.
If any provision of this Act, an amendment made by
